Curricular Practical Training Fact Sheet

Curricular Practical Training (CPT) is employment which is an integral part of an established curriculum. CPT is available to F-1 students who have been lawfully enrolled on a full time basis for at least nine consecutive months.

There are two categories of CPT:

- 1. **Required part of the degree program.** If the academic program requires employment in the field of study to graduate, the student may participate in CPT as long as he/she meets the other requirements of lawful status. If the employment is required, CPT need not be credit bearing.
- 2. **Optional part of the degree program.** Credit-bearing training opportunities that are an important part of the program of study may be used for CPT.

Student Eligibility:

- 1. Have maintained legal F-1 status for at least 9 consecutive months (exception: if the graduate program requires training before completion of one academic year, consult the ISA office)
- 2. Be enrolled in a course that carries academic credit (if not a requirement of the degree program)
- 3. Hold a job/training offer related to your major area of study (CPT is contingent on a solid offer)

Application Process:

- 1. Obtain a <u>CIU CPT Application Form</u>.
- 2. Obtain an offer letter (see <u>CPT Employer Information</u>)
- 3. Obtain appropriate academic advisor signature, course instructor information, and course description, as required by the CIU CPT Application Form.
- 4. Schedule an appointment with the International Student Advisor at least 3 weeks prior to your CPT start date.
- 5. Do not begin training until you receive the new I-20 listing the CPT start and end dates, employer name and address. Note: EAD from immigration is not required.

CPT Hours & Limitations:

- 1. CPT is approved for a specific employer, place of employment, and time period. You may not change employers.
- 2. Part time CPT is authorized up to 20 hours per week
- 3. Full time CPT is authorized for 20 hours per week or more
- 4. If you are authorized for 12 months or more full time CPT, you will not be eligible for OPT
